The Anna and J.G. Neufeld Science Centre is an important addition to the Trinity Western University campus because it substantially expands science programs in biology, chemistry, mathematics, computer science and professional studies.

Two storeys in design with a total area of 21,560 square feet, on the main level it features a 2,075 square foot lecture hall as well as chemistry laboratories and instructors' offices. On the lower level are classrooms, seminar rooms, another laboratory, and additional offices.

The Anna and J.G. Neufeld Science Centre also has enabled Trinity Western University to launch our new baccalaureate degree in nursing this past fall. The new facility includes specialized equipment such as hospital beds, spirometers, microscopes, and instrumentation stations. This expansion will facilitate the preparation of effective, ethical leaders in the health sciences.
